WALTER E. LONG METROPOLITAN PARK MASTER PLAN

PUBLIC MEETING OPEN HOUSE #1 SUMMARY

April 4, 2018, 6:00 - 8:00 PM

The first public meeting open house for the Walter E. Long Metropolitan Park Master Plan was held on April 4, 2018 at Decker Middle School. Over 50 people from throughout the region attended to provide input on future planning for the park. The majority of attendees (2/3) lived east of Interstate 35 (I-35) and south of US-290, though some attendees lived west of I-35 and even outside of the City limits.

A brief presentation and overview of the master planning process and progress to date was provided. Attendees then circulated throughout the room to review a series of informational boards, provide input on participatory boards, and engage in discussion. The open house was advertised through email and social media blasts, yard signs in surrounding neighborhoods and in other City parks, distribution of fliers, and phone calls. There were also many attendees who were invited by friends.

For the participatory portion of the meeting, attendees were asked to place stickers to indicate their top choices for types of improvements to the park. The topics they were asked about included Plan Goals, Active Recreation, Passive Recreation, Environmental/Natural Recreation, Arts & Cultural Recreation, Revenue Generation, General Park Design, and the overall Park Vision.

ADDITIONAL FEEDBACK

The project team received additional feedback from attendees at the open house. As seen above and on previous pages, general comments included requests to keep equestrian interests, hikers, golfers, disc golf players, and water sports enthusiasts in mind when upgrading trails, open spaces, and areas surrounding the lake. Attendees also wanted safety to be a priority, including safe places to run, bike, or walk. Preservation specialists understand the need for development, but have concerns about impacting the biodiversity of the land.

Community members from surrounding neighborhoods advised that they were in favor of a golf course, based on their understanding that it would bring much needed revenue to the area. Disc golf enthusiasts remarked on how cost effective, environmentally friendly, and profitable building a disc golf course would be. Lastly, some attendees expressed interest in expanding the Expo Center to accommodate larger events. A larger multi-purpose facility could encourage collaboration between Rodeo Austin, nearby businesses, and higher education (e.g., University of Texas sports program).
