Candlestick Cassia - *Senna alata* - Africa, Southeast Asia, Pacific Islands, Tropical America

Common Rue- *Ruta graveolens* –Europe

Dill - *Anethum graveolens*- Southern Russia, western Africa, Mediterranean region

Fennel - *Foeniculum vulgare* - Southern Europe, Mediterranean

Green Milkweed – *Asclepias Viridis* –South Central US.

Hardy Blue Passionflower - *Passiflora caerulea* - South America

Maypop Vine – *Passiflora incarnate* - US Native

Mexican Plum - *Prunus Mexicana* – US, Mexico

Missouri Violet - *Viola missouriensis* – US Native

Parsley - *Petroselinum crispum* – Mediterranean

Prairie tea - *Croton monanthogynus* – US Native

Red Bay- *Persea borbonia*- US Native - Larval food Source

Sweet Bay Tree - *Laurus nobilis* – Mediterranean

Spicebush - *Lindera benzoin* – US Native

Swamp Milkweed - *Asclepias incarnate* - Manitoba, Quebec, US.

Tropical Milkweed-*Asclepias curassavica* -South America

Toothache tree (Hercules ‘club) -*Zanthoxylum clava-herculis* – US Native

Three Lobed pipevine - *Aristolochia trilobata* – Central America

Velvet-leaf Mallow -*Allowissadula holosericea* – Texas, N.Mexico

Wafer Ash - *Ptelia trifoliata* – US Native

Wooly Pipevine - *Aristolochia tomentosa* - US Native

White Veined pipevine - *Aristolochia fimbriata* – South America

Winter Senna – *Senna bicapsularis* – South America

Yellow Flower Passion vine - *Passiflora lutea* – US Native



Nectar plants – Bloom Time

Spring Blooming – Many of these can bloom as early as February and most start to fade away with the heat of June.

Blackfoot Daisy-*Melampodium leucanthum* - US Native
Barbara’s Buttons - *Marshallia caespitosa* – US Native
Bottle Brush - *Callistemon spp.* – Australia
Buttonbush - *Cephalanthus occidentalis* – US Native
Blue Curls -*Phacelia congesta* – Texas, Arizona, Mexico
Cedar Sage- *Salvia roemeriana* – Central, West Texas, Coahuila and Nuevo Leon in Mexico
Dandelion -*Taraxacum officinale* – Eurasia, North and South America
Elbow bush - *Foresteria pubescens* – Native - Very early bloomer
Engelmann Daisy - *Engelmannia peristenia* – US Native
Fragrant Sumac - *Rhus aromatic* - US Native
Golden Groundsel – *Packera obovata*- Us Native
Golden ball lead tree - *Leucaena retusa* – Texas, n.Mexico
Gulf Coast Penstemon - *Penstemon tenuis* – Southern US.
Horsemint - *Monarda citriodora*- US Native, Mexico
Heartleaf Skullcap-*Scutellaria ovate*- US Native
Indian Blanket - *Gaillardia pulchella* –US Native
Indian Paintbrush - *Castilleja indivisa* –US Native
Mexican Buckeye – *Ungnadia speciosa* – Texas, s. NM to n.e. Mex.



Mexican Plum – *Prunus mexicana*- US, Mexico
Mexican Flame Vine - *Senecio confuses*-Mexico
Mexican Orchid Tree - *Bauhinia mexicana* – Mexico
Mock Orange - *Philadelphus coronaries* – US Native
Ox-eye Daisy- *Leucanthemum vulgare* – Europe
Red Clover - *Trifolium pretense* - Europe, Western Asia and northwest Africa
Rough-Leaf Dogwood - *Cornus drummondii* - US Native
Standing Cypress - *Ipomopsis rubra* - US Native
Spirea – “Bridalwreath” – Cultivar
Texas thistle - *Cirsium texanum* - Missouri, Oklahoma , Texas
White Clover - *Trifolium repens* - Europe, North Africa, and West Asia
Wild onion – *Allium spp.* – US Native
Yarrow - *Achillea millefolium* - Asia, Europe, North America

Summer Blooming – These typically start to bloom from May and many will bloom till first frost.

Button bush - *Cephalanthus occidentalis* – US Native
Butterfly Weed - *Asclepias tuberosa* – US Native
Betony Leaf Mistflower - *Conoclinium betonicifolium* – Texas Native
Blue Mistflower - *Conoclinium coelestinum* – US Native – Late summer bloom.

Oregano - *Origanum vulgare* - Eurasia, Mediterranean
Ox-eye Daisy - *Leucanthemum vulgare* – Europe
Pyramid bush – *Melochia tomentosa* - US Native
Partridge Pea - *Chamaecrista fasciculate* - US Native
Pink Skullcap - *Scutellaria suffrutescens* – Mexico
Purple Coneflower - *Echinacea purpurea* – US Native
Pentas - *Pentas lanceolata* - Africa
Pride of Barbados – *Caesalpinia pulcherima* – Cenral/South America
Purple Trailing Lantana - *Lantana montevidensis* - South America
Ruellia, Wild Petunia - *Ruellia nudiflora* – Texas, Arizona, Mexico
Red Porterweed - *Stachytarpheta mutabilis* - Mexico, Caribbean, South America
Rock rose - *Pavonia lasiopetala* – Texas, Mexico

Star Zinnia – *Zinnia angustifolia* – US, Mexico Native
Shrub Daisy – *Euryops pectinatus* – Africa
Scarlet Bouvardia – *Bouvardia ternifolia* – US Native
Society Garlic - *Tulbaghia violacea* – Africa
Tropical Milkweed - *Asclepias curassavica* – Mexico, C. America, S. America
Turks Cap - *Malvaviscus arboreus var. drummondii* - Southern US, Mexico
Tropical Sage - *Salvia coccinea* - Coastal South Carolina, Florida, Texas
Tall verbena - *Verbena bonariensis* - South America
Turks Cap - *Malvaviscus arboreus* – Mexico, Texas, Florida, Cuba
Tall Verbena - *Verbena bonariensis* – South America
Texas Lantana - *Lantana horrida* - Texas, NE Mexico
Verbena – *Verbena spp.* - Many varieties – America, Europe
Wooly Butterfly Bush - *Buddleia marrubiiifolia* – Southern Trans-Pecos Mexico
Woolley Bee Brush - *Aloysia macrostachya* - Southwest United States into Mexico
Walker's Low Catmint - *Nepeta × faassenii* - Cultivar
Western Ironweed - *Vernonia baldwinii* – US Native
Wooly Ironweed - *Vernonia lindheimeri* – Texas, N.Mexico
Yellow Cestrum – *Cestrum aurantiacum* - Guatemala
Zexmenia - *Wedelia texana* – Texas Native
Yellow Shrub Jessamine - *Cestrum aruantiacum* – Tropical America
Zinnias - *Zinnia spp.* Cultivar - Southern US, Mexico to S. America – Many varieties.

Fall Blooming – These can start to bloom from as early as August and last till the first freeze.

Narrow-Leaf Gay Feather - *Liatris mucronata* – US Native
Texas Kidneywood - *Eysenhardtia texana* –US Native
Texas Aster - *Symphyotrichum drummondii var, texanum* –US Native
Viburnum Mistflower – *Eupatorium viburnoides* - Mexico
White Mistflower - *Ageratina havanensis* - Edwards Plateau in TX, n. Mex., Cuba, Bahaman Islands
