IMPLEMENTING DEVELOPMENT IN TODS

Development projects within each TOD should be compatible with the vision developed during the creation of the Station Area Plan (SAP). Even though development and/or redevelopment may occur on a parcel-by-parcel basis, the Station Area Plan serves as a guide and provides an understanding of what developers should work towards in a particular TOD district. Additionally, regulations included in the Regulating Plan have been tailored to meet the expectations of the surrounding neighborhoods and to promote development forms that can support existing and future transit. Projects that have the SAP vision as their foundation are more likely to be supported by the surrounding community.
