Major patterns for January auto thefts were:

- Trucks: 41 cases in January
- Hondas: 29 cases (mid 90's) in January
- Motorcycles: 8 cases in January
- In 42% of auto thefts, keys were used to steal the vehicles (keys left in vehicle, lost keys, etc)

### CRIME PREVENTION TIPS:

- Never leave your car running, even if you'll only be gone for a minute - vehicles are commonly stolen at convenience stores, gas stations, your home while you are warming up your car on a cold day.
- Park in well-lit areas or attended lots – auto thieves do not like witnesses and prefer unattended parking lots.
- Don't leave valuables in plain view - purses/wallets, cell phones, laptops, electronics, money, jewelry, garage door opener, personal information, etc.
