

Project History and Background

- April 2016: City Council asks City staff to explore options for extending Meadow Lake Blvd.
- October 2016 to February 2017: Engineering review begins
- July 2017: Design phase begins
- Sept. 2017: City Council approves funding to complete project
- June 2018: A community meeting is held at Perez Elementary School
- June to August 2020: Start environmental review for creek; finalize plan for drainage
- May 2021: All permits secured
- September 2021: Construction contract signed

Project Overview


 Project Scope: Increase mobility for residents in the neighborhood by extending Meadow Lake Boulevard from Misty Slope Lane to Quicksilver Boulevard. The project will include sidewalks, protected bicycle lanes and other traffic improvements.

• **Project Goal:** Provide a safer and more available route to schools in the area, including Perez elementary. Improve mobility for residents in the area.


Project Features

- Protected two-way bike lanes
- Installation of sidewalks
- Two one-way travel lanes
- Street lighting
- Parallel parking
- Storm drain
- Detention and water quality ponds
- Erosion control and improved storm water movement

What to expect during construction

- Temporary water service shut-outs (five lots near project area). Project inspector will hand out written notices 48 hours in advance.
- The inspector will work with contractor to ensure traffic impacts are as minimal as possible. Access for some driveways may be temporarily impacted for homes on Meadow Lake Blvd near the project area.
- Residents may notice an increase in truck traffic due to construction material delivery. The project will comply with the City's noise ordinance.
- Allowable work hours will be Monday-Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Project Contacts

The project inspector will be the primary point of contact for residents in the project area. They will oversee the day-to-day operations of this project. We strive to maintain direct communication with residents and will remain available for any questions or concerns.
