


## Neighborhood Partnering Program Application Summary



## Quality of Life Enhancements & Incorporation of City Initiatives

- An opportunity for the disabled to participate, with a specifically raised garden bed that is not found in most community Vegetable Gardens.
- Develop land use and transportation policies and regulations that promote the development of projects that promote more active and healthy lifestyles, such as community gardens, tree-shaded sidewalks and trails, bicycle parking, showers within office buildings, and having daily needs within proximity to home and work.( LUT A11)
- Establish a regulatory environment that creates communities across Austin that: provides a range of facilities and services such as schools, parks, community gardens, and other public gathering spaces. (HN A24)
