It is an amendment to the base recommendation from Planning Commission Recommendation 20231024-31 (see Amendment ID-1). The revised text recommended by Planning Commission "Design policies to promote" is not consistent with ASMP Indicator/Target language. It is not a measurable item, and therefore is not considered an Indicator or Target by ASMP definition. Therefore, staff does not support this change as it affects the integrity of the ASMP component definitions. The amendment to the base recommendation was provided by Commissioner Haynes, who had concern that incorporating the word 'Increase' would affect ASMP/City policy without due diligence and a public process. Therefore Haynes proposed the new text and this amendment was approved 7-5 by Planning Commission (Connolly absent). Staff recommends keeping the original text recommended by the Planning Commission as shown in Amendment ID-1.
