

## GOAL OF PILOT AND LONGER-TERM DISCUSSION

**Pilot goal:** Balance access, safety and mobility opportunities for residents and visitors through parking management.

"The implementation of RPP is to address primarily quality of life issues; issues regarding safety or mobility may enjoy some degree of relief due to RPP, but they along with nuisance or security issues are more appropriately addressed through other means or programs."

## PARKING TRANSACTIONS

## 90 days of Park ATX transactions (May 7-Aug. 5) — 9,315 transactions

- \*8,985 transactions on Scottish Woods Trail (includes 123 validated sessions)
  - -8,858 in paid parking area (Zone 39008)
  - 117 in resident parking ghost zone (includes 75 validated sessions)
- 330 transactions on side streets (includes 111 validated sessions)
- 1,058 of all transactions were extensions –11% or 1 out of 9




#### PARK ATX TRANSACTION PATTERNS

- •Activity levels
  - Lowest on Tuesdays and increases day by day
  - Peak on Saturdays ( $\sim 2.5x$  Fridays) and remains high on Sundays
- Average paid session, Scottish Woods Trail 2.5 hours




## PARKING ENFORCEMENT

- \*Assistance with app issues with public
- Constraints on staffing and scheduling




# SCOTTISH WOODS TRAIL PAID PARKING MINUTES (90 DAYS)





# TRANSACTIONS IN RESIDENT ZONES BY HOUR (90 DAYS)




### COMMUNITY FEEDBACK RESPONSES

  - ❖Surrey Hill Drive: 2




## RESIDENT FEEDBACK ON CONDITIONS

#### RESIDENT OPINIONS OF GUEST PARKING AVAILABILITY


Rate the experience of having guests find a parking space on the street






### TRAIL VISITOR FEEDBACK

#### SUMMARY OF SURVEY AND EMAIL COMMENTS

#### Residents

- Traffic volumes still high and crowding all streets
- Hang tags easy to use; request more than 2
- Validation codes inconvenient for daily use
- App issues
- Need more enforcement, especially on weekends
- Fire and EMS access concerns
- Constant mailbox obstructions on Scottish Woods Trail impeding mail delivery
- No-parking street households are unable to park on RPP side streets as they previously were allowed
- Trailhead should be moved

#### **Visitors**

- Concerns about privatization of public trail
- Public street parking is for public use
- Limited access during "off-peak" times/seasons
- Too expensive; barriers to affordability for lowincome visitors
- Need physical pay station
  - App issues due to poor signal connection
  - Digital payment environment poses barriers to access
- RPP is not appropriate for this area
- Paid parking does not address visitor behavior
- Parking lot would be more ideal




## CURRENT CONFIGURATION

- Public parking on Scottish Woods Trail
- Residential permit parking on side streets
- \*\$2/hour; 8a.m.-8p.m. daily

#### Recorded Concerns

Parking demand on Scottish Woods Trail creates similar conditions that generated original request for managing traffic and parking demand.



### POST-PILOT OPTIONS FOR LONG-TERM SOLUTION

#### Option A: Keep it

- Keep current configuration on Scottish Woods Trail
  - Minor adjustments to permit administration, signage, street markings, parking hours, and pricing structure

#### **Option B: Change it**

Modify street configuration to balance paid parking and residential permit parking to ease demand from Scottish Woods Trail

#### **Option C: Remove it**

Remove pilot parking regulations in neighborhood and return to pre-pilot conditions



#### IF WE KEEP IT OR CHANGE IT...

In the short-term, Austin Transportation would implement these changes

- Install physical pay station at trailhead
- Remove digital validation codes for resident parking
- Pending approval from Area Engineer, mark parking spaces to mitigate obstructions to driveways and mailboxes

Longer-term changes will depend on results from next survey.
