# **Austin City Council Resolution**

August 4, 2011

Directs staff to develop a city ordinance providing a "comprehensive phase-out of single-use plastic bags offered at retail checkouts"

 Requested by Council to expand the public discussion to include paper bags and market drivers such as fees

#### **Austin Zero Waste Policies**

#### 21.3 Single-Use Products and Packaging Ordinances

- The goal of this initiative is to reduce single-use and non-recyclable products and packaging.
- ➤ The City will consider developing ordinances with the goal of reducing or eliminating consumption and generation of the following products: Single-use bags; Non-recyclable, non-compostable take-out containers; and Single-use beverage containers.

#### **Ordinance Purpose**

Replaces Retail Carry-out Single-Use Bags with defined Reusable/Recyclable Bags

#### **Exemptions** (< 10% of all plastic bags)

- Dry Cleaner Bags and Yard Waste Bags
- Produce, Meat, and Frozen Foods Bags
- Door-hanger Bags and Newspaper Bags
- Prescription Drug Carry-Out Bags
- Beer, Wine and Spirits Carry-out Bags
- Restaurant Carry-out Bags

#### **Reusable Bags Options**

- ➤ Reusable Carry-out Bags 3 choices
  - Cloth, washable fabric, or other durable materials
  - Recyclable paper with minimum weight and handle
  - Recyclable plastic with minimum thickness

#### **Implementation Timeline**

- ▶ Phase 1: Education: March 1, 2012 February 28, 2013
- ▶ Phase 2: Transition: March 1, 2013 February 28, 2014
  - Transition away from Retail Checkout Single Use Bags
  - 10 cents per Single-Use Bag or \$1 per transaction
  - Retailers and Customers Transition to Reusable Bags
- Phase 3: March 1, 2014 No Retail Checkout Single-Use Bags

## **Hardship Variance**

- Customers with Lone Star Card exempt from fees
- Retailers may petition for Hardship Variance

#### **Other Elements**

- Retailer Signage Requirements
- Customer Education at Point of Purchase
- Fee Surcharge to fund Public Education
- City dedicated fund restricted use of fee revenues
- Prohibits carryout bags at all City facilities

#### **Other Elements**

- > 10 cent Bag Fee or \$1.00 per Transaction Fee
  - 50% of Fees kept by Retailers, 50% to City Restrictive Use Fund
  - Fee Revenue must be utilized for retailer transition costs, public education and bag distribution

#### Exemptions / "carve-outs"

- Ordinance requires majority of exempted bags to be recyclable
- Reusable bag definitions
  - Recyclable Paper and Recyclable Plastic
  - Requires Handles on Reusable Bags
- Expanded bag recycling opportunities
  - City commitment to expand collection options
