RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 710225-C duly passed by the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, an election by the qualified voters of the City was held in the City of Austin on April 3, 1971, for the purpose of electing six councilmen and a mayor of the City of Austin for a term of two years beginning May 15, 1971, and for the purpose of submitting, as a non-binding referendum, a proposition for or against the fluoridation of the public water supply; and,

WHEREAS, by virtue of said election, the official returns from the election officials and the canvass thereof by the City Council it appears that the following votes were received at said election as indicated below, to-wit:

WHEREAS, it appears that Roy Butler has received a majority of all the votes cast in said election for Mayor; that S. H. (Bud) Dryden has received a majority of all the votes cast in said election for Councilman Place No. 1; that Dick Nichols and Jay L. Johnson, Jr. were the two candidates who received the highest number of votes in said election for Councilman Place No. 2, no candidate having received a majority of the votes cast for said place; that Dan Love has received a majority of all the votes cast in said election for Councilman Place No. 3; that Lowell Lebermann has received a majority of all the votes cast in said election for Councilman Place No. 4; that Jeffrey M. Friedman and Wick Fowler were the two candidates who received the highest number of votes in said election for Councilman Place No. 5, no candidate having received a majority of the votes cast for said place; that Berl Handcox and Harry Smith were the two candidates who received the highest number of votes in said election for Councilman Place No. 6, no candidate having received a majority of the votes cast for said place; and,

WHEREAS, it further appears that a majority of the votes received on the non-binding referendum proposition regarding the fluoridation of the public water supply were cast for the fluoridation of the public water supply of the City of Austin; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That, in accordance with said returns, as received and canvassed, the following named persons are hereby declared duly elected and authorized to qualify for the position of Mayor and for the positions of Councilmen for the City

of Austin for a term of two years, beginning May 15, 1971:

That in accordance with said returns, as received and canvassed, that Dick Nichols and Jay L. Johnson, Jr. are hereby declared to be the two candidates who have received the highest number of votes in said election for Councilman Place No. 2; and,

That in accordance with said returns, as received and canvassed, that Jeffrey M. Friedman and Wick Fowler are hereby declared to be the two candidates who have received the highest number of votes in said election for Councilman Place No. 5; and,

That in accordance with said returns, as received and canvassed, that Berl Handcox and Harry Smith are hereby declared to be the two candidates who have received the highest number of votes in said election for Councilman Place No. 6.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That in accordance with said returns, as received and canvassed, it is recognized that the number of votes cast regarding the non-binding referendum proposition as to whether there should be fluoridation of the public water supply of the City of Austin, there were 33,992 votes cast for the fluoridation of

the public water supply of the City of Austin and 12,893 votes cast against the fluoridation of the public water supply of the City of Austin.

WHEREAS, by virtue of said election, the official returns from the election officials and the canvass thereof of the City Council, it appears that the following votes were received at said election as indicated below, to-wit:

WHEREAS, it further appears that a majority of the votes received on the referendum proposition regarding the fluoridation of the public water supply were cast for the fluoridation of the public water supply of the City of Austin; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That in accordance with said returns, as received and canvassed, it is recognized that the number of votes cast regarding the referendum proposition as to whether there should be fluoridation of the public water supply of the City of Austin, there were 16,964 votes cast for the fluoridation of the public water supply of the City of Austin and 12,687 votes

cast against the fluoridation of the public water supply of the City of Austin.

Now, Therefore, in accordance with the returns of said election, the City administrative forces are hereby directed to initiate and complete such actions as are necessary to fluoridate the public water supply of the City of Austin.
