

# WaterWise Rainscape Rebate Program




Homeowners and schools may receive up to \$500 \$0.30/sq. foot --100 sq. foot min.) for installing landscape features such as rain gardens, berms, swales, terraces, and porous pavement that direct and retain rainwater on the property

# Eligibility



- Austin Water residential/school customer or qualifying water provider
- Size of conversion area (100sqft min)
- Have not started work on the conversion (must be accepted into the program first)

## Rain Gardens



### **Native Plants**

Native plants are adapted to local conditions and are easy to maintain once established. Plus, they attract birds, butterflies and other pollinators.

### Gutters & Down Spouts

Assist with directing rain water from your roof to your rain garden.

### Deep Roots

Plants with a deep root system encourage infiltration and help absorb nutrients.

### Berm

A berm holds water in the garden during heavy rains.
