



Objectives

Definitions

-  **Creek Access**
Potential informal access points in locations of existing access; stabilize with native stone and boulders to reduce erosion, create 'found' locations of easier access.
-  **Creek Crossing**
Stabilized Rock-Hop crossing locations connected by trail access.
-  **Overlook**
More formal locations for stopping and viewing the creek environment. May have benches or other seating options, mulch or flagstone walking surfaces, clearly indicated access from trails.
-  **Minor Overlook**
Informally developed locations for viewing of creek or other features. Seating may be large boulders or logs, access less defined, such as openings in understory plantings or mulch surfaces.
-  **View Points**
Locations where longer views into the park or down the creek corridor are recognized and preserved.
