Virtual Meeting Purpose

To gather input on initiating a pilot intergenerational resource and activity center (or programming) partnership program at Nash Hernandez Building, Rudy Mendez Recreation Center, George Morales Dove Springs Recreation Center, or Dittmar Recreation Center.

At the end of this meeting, participants should be able to:

- Be aware of what City Council is asking the City of Austin to explore;
- Understand what intergenerational programming is; and
- Learn about the process around the Nash Hernandez Building.



Background

- Growing need for care for older adults and ongoing need for childcare
- Intergenerational Advisory Group exploring possible locations for intergenerational center (older adults and early childhood)
- Nash Hernandez Building: Former AFD Arson Museum, transferred to PARD in 2012





City Council Direction

- Resolution No. 20181018-041:
 - Review and assess need for adult day center on City-owned facilities, such as RBJ Public Health Center
 - Determine feasibility at city-owned facilities
 - Recommend process for developing an adult day center at City-owned facilities
- Resolution No. 20220616-089:
 - Feasibility and fiscal impact of IRAC pilot program at Nash Hernandez Building
 - Survey City-owned parcels and review co-location opportunities in zip codes other than 78702
 - Identify funding source(s) if Nash Hernandez Building is not feasible



City Council Direction

- Resolution No. 2022-1208-059:
 - Partner with City departments and the IDC Advisory Group to work towards the implementation of an IRAC that will address the need for resources and provide a better quality of life for the fast-growing senior and low-income population of Austin, while also addressing the needs of childcare in the 78702 zip code area and surrounding areas.
 - COA work with the IDC Advisory Group to identify licenses, certifications, and funding resources, including, but not limited to, public private partnerships, creative financing options, revenue generation at the property, and other potential means required for an IRAC, and return to Council with proposals that have been reviewed to ensure compliance with any requirements, legal or otherwise. necessary to fund an IRAC at the Nash Hernandez Building.



City Council Direction

- Resolution No. 2022-1208-059:
 - Conduct community stakeholder engagement meetings to gather input on initiating a pilot IRAC partnership program at Nash Hernandez Building and at the locations recommended by the Parks and Recreation Department [Mendez Recreation Center, Dittmar Recreation Center, and George Morales Dove Springs Recreation Center].
